



Strategic community partnerships



Partnerships with a purpose

By aligning our community engagement efforts with our diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI) initiatives, HCA Midwest Health is able to make a greater impact through strategic partnerships. For example:

- HCA Midwest Health partnered with the Spanish-speaking network Telemundo on several initiatives to provide access to health information to the area's Hispanic residents. Bilingual surgeon Dr. Roger de la Torre (pictured top left) spoke at a 2022 Telemundo Health Fair, and HCA Midwest Health leaders like Angel Monroy (pictured top right) were featured in the station's Hispanic Heritage Month public service announcements, reaching more than 65,000 Hispanic households in the Kansas City region.
- Overland Park Regional Medical Center partnered with Cristo Rey Kansas City for a healthcare work study initiative for high school students (pictured bottom left). Four students spent one day a week for eight months working in clinical, food services and administrative roles. The initiative, now going on its sixth year, helps expose students to healthcare careers. Cristo Rey students also have work study opportunities within HCA Midwest Physicians.
- Research Medical Center colleagues partnered with representatives from Kansas City's 5th District for Operation Backpack, (pictured bottom right) which provided much-needed school supplies to 400+ families throughout the district.
- Research Medical Center, Overland Park Regional Medical Center and Menorah Medical Center colleagues donated more than 6,500 rolls of toilet paper to support the Jewish Family Services' Summer Wipe Out campaign. While the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) provides access to food for families in need, personal items like this are usually not covered.

American Heart Association

In October 2022, HCA Healthcare and the American Heart Association (AHA) announced a national partnership called "Getting to the Heart of Stroke." This initiative is aimed at educating consumers and caregivers about the heart-brain connection and empowering communities to improve health outcomes by preventing, treating and beating stroke. Locally, efforts included:

- Improving the overall health of Kansas City residents by addressing disparities through local health impact work in the areas of women's health and well-being, high blood pressure management, nutrition security or tobacco/vaping prevention.
- · Launching the "Libraries with Heart" collaborative initiative among HCA Midwest Health, AHA and the Kansas City Public Library to provide library visitors access to blood pressure cuffs, self-monitoring blood pressure kits, educational materials and - if needed referrals to healthcare resources.
- Showing up in a big way for the 2022 Kansas City Heart Walk through sponsorship and participation.

Leukemia & Lymphoma Society

Cancer prevention and treatment remains a priority impact area for HCA Midwest Health, and we've cultivated a deeper relationship with the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society over the past nine years to support the organization's efforts to fund a cure for cancer. Through the strategic partnership, we've promoted the Sarah Cannon Cancer Institute at HCA Midwest Health and

the Sarah Cannon Transplant and Cellular Therapy program at Research Medical Center, as well as sponsored and participated in fundraising events, such as the organization's annual Light the Night Walk.

Through these roles, she's helped youth from across the state develop leadership skills, adopt a service mindset and implement community outreach and volunteerism in their young lives. Some of the service projects she's helped them

spearhead include making dog toys for animal shelters, hygiene kits for homeless shelters, and comfort items for care homes, NICUs and cancer centers. Over the years, Marlene has logged her hundreds and hundreds of volunteer hours in HCA Healthcare's volunteering and giving program, which rewards colleagues for their generosity. So not only have the youth benefited from Marlene's volunteerism, so has KAYAN as she's gifted her monetary rewards right back to the organization.

Giving and volunteering

Colleagues throughout HCA Midwest Health are driven by our mission to care for and improve human life. That mission extends outside the walls of our facilities and into our communities. Whether it's through volunteering our time, making charitable donations or collaborating with community leaders to help solve community problems, we are committed to improving more lives in more ways.

HCA Healthcare rewards colleagues for their volunteering and financial generosity through its giving and volunteering matching program. For every 10 hours volunteered and logged, colleagues receive \$200 for the charity of their choice — with an opportunity to earn up to \$1,000 a year. And colleagues can request an HCA Healthcare matching gift to an eligible charity — with the opportunity to receive up to \$1,000 a year in matching gifts.

Healthy Food for Healthier **Tomorrows**

Community food insecurity remains a top priority for our health system, and HCA Midwest Health participated in HCA Healthcare's 2022 Healthy Food for Healthier Tomorrows food and nutrition drive. Through this voluntary, enterprisewide contest to raise awareness about food insecurity in our communities, facility teams were tasked with collecting food donations from colleagues for a local food bank and then building a structure from the donations for a chance to win \$10,000 for their eligible food bank of choice.

The local winner was then submitted for consideration for the additional HCA Healthcare \$25,000 enterprise award.

The Lee's Summit Medical Center team's submission, "Rooted in Our Values," won both the local and enterprise awards. The tree structure's roots were decorated with "ICARE Because" cards detailing colleagues' "why" for giving.

Lee's Summit Meals on Wheels

Now in its 47th year of partnership, Lee's Summit Medical Center continues to support Lee's Summit Meals on Wheels' mission of providing well-balanced and nutritious meals for elderly and disabled citizens.

Through its food services team, kitchen and resources, Lee's Summit Medical Center helps prepare the 65-70 meals the organization delivers daily. Because meals are prepared on-site, the hospital's food

services team can accommodate special dietary requests, such as low-sodium or heart-healthy meals. Lee's Summit Meals on Wheels was one of the organizations Lee's Summit Medical Center supported through its Healthy Food for Healthier Tomorrows winnings.

Protecting youth mental health

As a learning health system, HCA Healthcare understands the important role early education can play in addressing the mental well-being of kids and adolescents. HCA Healthcare is proud to partner with EVERFI, an international technology company driving social change through education, to implement an interactive mental health and wellness digital education course for middle and high school students.

- Since 2020, the Understanding Mental Wellness course has reached more than 150,000 middle and high school students at 866 schools across the country.
- In Kansas City, EVERFI served 583 students across eight schools in 2022, with several more in initial implementation phases.



Crushing the opioid crisis

As communities continue to see opioid-related deaths increase throughout the country, HCA Midwest Health joined our sister HCA Healthcare facilities for our annual Crush the Crisis drug take-back event. HCA Healthcare expanded eligible collection items to include all medications and opioids, vape cartridges and pet medications to make a real difference for patients, families and communities.

In October 2022, all six metro area HCA Midwest Health hospitals were proud to be among the 110 HCA Healthcare facilities across 17

states to host a Crush the Crisis drug take-back event, which aligned with the Drug Enforcement Administration's National Prescription Take Back Day in partnership with local law enforcement. The goal was to raise awareness of opioid addiction and educate community members of the proper way to dispose of unused and expired medications.

In total, HCA Healthcare facilities collected a record 19,423 pounds of medication, which equates to approximately 13.4 million doses, thereby eliminating the possibility of potential misuse.

Servant leader dedicated to helping others

Growing up in a house with no utilities and having minimal clothes and food might make one resentful toward others. But not Kelly Walker, whose mother taught him to always be grateful because there's always someone worse off. That outlook shaped Kelly, manager of Patient Admitting for Belton Regional Medical Center, into the servant leader he is today. Helping others began during childhood, when Kelly volunteered in his church's soup kitchen, and continues today. His service includes funding student scholarships, hosting blood drives, coaching kids' sports and providing meals and medical care to the homeless. During college, Kelly joined the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, an organization that fueled — and still fuels his community service drive. During every interaction with others, Kelly shares this piece of advice: "Live life, love life, help others."

Healthy meals for a healthier community

Thanks to a \$1.4 million renovation, staff, patients and visitors now have a modern, healthy dining experience in Lafayette Regional Health Center's new state-ofthe-art cafeteria. With new tables, chairs, equipment and an adjoining office space and break room, there's plenty of room to accommodate nearly 50 people. The gleaming glass front near the main entrance welcomes community members who don't have many dining options in Lexington, Missouri, to come in for a healthy meal.



Environmental stewardship

As stewards of the environment, we take a proactive approach to make communities healthier and protect the environment by implementing greening hospital practices, promoting conservation, decreasing waste and exercising environmentally conscious purchasing.

In 2022, our HCA Midwest Health hospital and facility teams collected:

- 4,670 pounds recycled batteries
- 1,193,782 pounds recycled plastics, metal/aluminum cans, paper, newspapers, cardboard, paperboard
- 179,088 pounds corrugated cardboard
- 2,224 pounds universal waste (lamps/bulbs)
- 171,000 pounds compost

HCA Midwest Health is committed to reducing the amount of waste going to area landfills.



Greening the Operating Room

HCA Healthcare is a founding sponsor of the Greening the Operating Room initiative, which seeks to identify key interventions that can reduce waste, energy usage and worker exposure to hazardous chemicals and costs. HCA Healthcare is the first health system to recommend all of its hospitals commit to Greening the OR.

• In 2022, HCA Midwest Health facilities collected more than 17,400 single-use medical devices for reprocessing or recycling, which diverted more than 1,167 pounds of waste from landfills.

Ensuring convenient access

With more than 2,000 physicians on staff, 75 physician practices within our HCA Midwest Physicians network and thousands of physicians affiliated with our facilities, HCA Midwest Health offers clinical expertise and access to advanced patient-centered care through our more than 200 access points.

Telehealth expands our reach

As one of the area's leaders in telehealth, HCA Midwest Health has proudly provided innovative programs to more than 20 communities outside the Kansas City metro area. Telehealth gives patients in rural areas local access to medical specialists, allowing them to receive treatment in their local communities. And rural healthcare providers get 24-hour access to specialized expertise, which improves the immediate care for their patients and helps keep costs lower for everyone by not having to transfer patients.

In fact, in 2022, our partner outreach facilities were able to keep about 60% of stroke patients in their facilities or discharge them directly home from the emergency department thanks to our stroke/ neurology telehealth services.

Ambulatory surgery centers

HCA Midwest Health's outpatient ambulatory surgery centers (ASCs) offer patients expert, compassionate care for routine, complex and emergency procedures. Our ASCs offer convenient locations with lower costs in many cases. We have seven ASC locations throughout the metro area with plans to open two more in 2024.

CareNow urgent care centers

HCA Midwest Health's CareNow urgent care centers provide a wide range of services with the convenience of extended hours, walk-in visits, online check-ins and virtual visits. Patients have fast, convenient and affordable care for minor illnesses and injuries through our CareNow urgent care centers located throughout the metro area, including new locations in Prairie Village and Lee's Summit.

In addition, CareNow offers such services as occupational medicine, sports physicals, drug screenings and vaccinations for patients, businesses and community members.

Advancing equitable care

While providing easy access to care is important, we would much prefer to keep community members healthy and avoid them needing our services altogether. Through a strategic partnership with the American Heart Association, HCA Midwest Health is working to help communities prevent heart disease and stroke through the "Getting to the Heart of Stroke" initiative.

In addition, the HCA Healthcare Foundation announced an enterprise-wide Health Equity Catalyst Grant to address food insecurity and access to healthy foods in communities across the nation in 2023. As part of this initiative, HCA Midwest Health will award a \$25,000 grant to a partner organization to help make an impact in the Greater Kansas City area.

Equity of care

HCA Midwest Health recognizes the diverse backgrounds of our patients, partners, physicians and colleagues, and we are committed to providing all patients with equitable access to culturally competent, patient-centered care.

- We provide interpreters via phone, video and face-to-face, as well as auxiliary aids, to assist with communication.
- We focus on access to services, including web accessibility, to ensure patients can perceive, understand, navigate and interact with our facilities and clinics.



Making the grade for quality and safety

HCA Midwest Health takes pride in our clinical outcomes, patient experience and patient safety records. In fact, our commitment and passion for patient safety is unsurpassed in the region and has been validated by several third-party organizations that monitor hospital quality.

Healthgrades, the leading marketplace connecting doctors and patients, recently named four HCA Midwest Health facilities among its 250 America's Best Hospitals:

In addition, Centerpoint Medical Center and Menorah Medical Center were each recognized as a Top 50 Best Hospital in the Country for Surgical Care out of 4,500 hospitals across the country. They were the only hospitals in the Kansas City region to earn this honor.

Patient safety drives clinical practices

As part of HCA Healthcare, HCA Midwest Health teams follow evidence-based protocols and best practices to drive patient safety and ensure the best possible outcomes for our patients. Some of these include:

- Enhanced Surgical Recovery (ESR) This program is a patient-centered, researchbased, multidisciplinary approach to surgical recovery that allows patients to play an active role in managing their own care and recovery plan. ESR implements select interventions before, during and after surgeries to improve outcomes and reduce opioid usage.
- SPOT (Sepsis Prediction & Optimization of Therapy) This algorithm and workflow for early sepsis detection and treatment helps safeguard patients from hospital acquired infections.
- Electronic Prescribing of Controlled Substances (EPCS) Through this program, physicians have access to aggregated electronic health records that make it more difficult for medication-seekers to doctor-shop or alter prescriptions. In addition, providers with our HCA Midwest Physicians group track compliance with providers and clinics as well, and intervene on high or unsafe prescribing habits with awareness and education.





Boosting the blood supply

When a national shortage of blood products affected hospitals in the Kansas City region, HCA Midwest Health's Laboratory Services team worked with a major regional blood supplier to develop blood management processes. This involved partnering with the system's supply chain team to ensure our facilities had adequate blood resources to care for patients.

In addition, facilities throughout HCA Midwest Health hosted multiple on-site blood drives for our colleagues and community members to help replenish supplies.

Providing innovative care

HCA Midwest Health partners across HCA Healthcare's approximately 2,300 sites of care to conduct leading-edge research, share best practices and support, and develop technologies to improve patient care. As a result, patients have access to advanced therapies and services - many of which cannot be found through other Kansas City area healthcare providers.

Virtual nursing benefits patients and staff

Throughout our organization, we continue to look for new and innovative ways to address nursing staff shortages, support nurses and provide mentorship opportunities for new nurses. In 2022, HCA Midwest Health's Menorah Medical Center was the first hospital within HCA Healthcare to pilot a virtual nursing care model to do just that.

Using iPads, designated nurses in off-site command centers virtually connect with patients and bedside nurses to assist with administrative tasks related to admitting and discharging patients, helping explain medications to improve patients' medication management and providing discharge instructions.

Since the initial pilot, the virtual nursing program has expanded to other hospitals within HCA Midwest Health and HCA Healthcare.





Sarah Cannon Cancer Institute pioneers cancer therapies

Sarah Cannon Cancer Institute at HCA Midwest Health is a networkaccredited cancer program (one of only 63 nationally to earn network accreditation) that provides world-class cancer care to patients throughout the region. Through innovative clinical research trials, we're working to advance cancer care and bring life-changing therapies to patients.

HCA Midwest Health has 16 clinical trials actively exploring treatments for blood, breast, GI, neurological, thoracic and gynecological cancers.

Leading heart and vascular care

As the region's heart care leader, HCA Midwest Health is proud of the fact that we care for the most hearts in Kansas City. Patients throughout the region — and throughout the country — seek our expert comprehensive treatments for all stages of heart disease.

Through the HCA Midwest Heart & Vascular Institute and Kansas City Heart Rhythm Institute, our cardiovascular and electrophysiology experts are pioneering the latest lifesaving treatments through multiple cardiology clinical trials, as well as bringing the latest technology to area patients. This includes being the only heart program in the Kansas City region (and first in the state of Kansas) to offer the photon-counting advanced imaging system and the first in the country to enroll patients in a cutting-edge study to treat Inappropriate Sinus Tachycardia (IST). And our accredited Chest Pain Centers routinely exceed the national quality goal of door-to-angioplasty time to treat heart attacks.



Advancing stroke and neurologic treatments

HCA Midwest Health's Neuroscience Institute offers patients comprehensive care from a team of multidisciplinary experts for disorders or injuries of the brain, spine or nerves through seven locations throughout the metro area. This includes offering some of the most cutting-edge treatments and clinical trials available in the region.

In addition, our five accredited stroke centers provide fast, expert care for conditions ranging from stroke-like transient ischemic attacks (TIA) to complex stroke symptoms.



Caring for the most vulnerable

As a women's and children's services leader. HCA Midwest Health delivers more babies and cares for more fragile newborns than any other area health system. Thanks to our Level III neonatal intensive care units (NICUs) at Overland Park Regional Medical Center, Research Medical Center and Centerpoint Medical Center and a Level II NICU at Menorah Medical Center, critically ill mothers and their babies can find the expert care they need whether they live on the Kansas or Missouri sides of the metro.

All HCA Midwest Health NICUs are staffed with neonatologists, neonatal nurse practitioners and infant care specialists. In addition, our Maternal and Neonatal Transport teams based at Overland Park Regional Medical Center have helped safely transfer hundreds of babies and mothers from throughout the Kansas City region, as well as rural areas of Kansas and Missouri, since this service launched in 2021.

Through these annual NICU reunions, our caregivers get to see the graduates' amazing progress and further strengthen the bonds they've made with their patients and family members.

In October 2022, Overland Park Regional Medical Center hosted its annual NICU reunion to celebrate its graduates. Nearly 1,500 attendees turned out for the carnival-themed event, which included bounce houses, face painters, balloon artists, entertainment, food and plenty of fun for the kids and adults alike.

Lifesaving trauma and emergency care

HCA Midwest Health provides community members with access to lifesaving trauma and emergency care throughout the metro. As a Level I trauma center, Research Medical Center is one of only two verified Level I trauma centers in Kansas City, Missouri, and the fifth verified adult trauma center in the state of Missouri. This designation recognizes Research Medical Center for providing the most advanced surgical care for trauma

patients, demonstrating successful outcomes and participating in research that contributes to trauma care innovations.

In addition, HCA Midwest Health also offers two Level II trauma centers — Overland Park Regional Medical Center and Centerpoint Medical Center and a Level III trauma center at Belton Regional Medical Center.



The gift of life

With one of the busiest emergency departments in the metro area, the staff at Centerpoint Medical Center's Level II trauma center treat a range of patients needing 24/7 emergency critical care. In 2022, the hospital had 59,356 emergency department visits. The facility has strong relationships with area first responders and other agencies, including the Midwest Transplant Network.

Helping a poet regain his voice and life

When a traumatic brain injury robbed Noah Weaver, a 26-year-old poet and rapper, of his ability to talk and walk, he found help from Research Medical Center's Level I trauma center team, ICU staff and rehab experts. Noah was transported via life flight to Research Medical Center on May 27, 2022, after hitting a guardrail and flipping his car. He spent about a month recovering from his injuries, which also included nerve damage in his hand, before being discharged to continue inpatient therapy at a Nebraska rehabilitation center specializing in brain injury patients. There, Noah further regained and refined his motor and speech-language skills, including mastering tongue twisters. Noah returned to Research Medical Center in November 2022 to thank the EMS crew and caregivers who saved his life and voice — so he was able to return to open mic nights and perform his poetry.



Fast care keeps this patient's heart beating strong

When Ronald Crews' wife found him unconscious in their living room and making gurgling sounds, she called 9-1-1. Finding Ronald pulseless, first responders started CPR, initiated an IV and then used a defibrillator to shock his heart. He was transported by ambulance to Centerpoint Medical Center where he was stabilized and diagnosed as suffering a heart attack due to a blocked artery. Ronald underwent a coronary artery bypass graft surgery and then completed cardiac rehab. Thanks to the first responders' and Centerpoint Medical Center team's lifesaving care, Ronald made a full recovery and celebrated by taking his wife on a Hawaiian vacation. He returned to the hospital in October 2022 for a "Great Save" event where he was able to personally thank all those who saved his life.





Advanced orthopedic care

From routine procedures to complex joint replacements, HCA Midwest Health's boardcertified orthopedic specialists use the latest advances and technology to give pediatric and adult patients the best possible outcomes. We treat a range of chronic bone and joint conditions, as well as provide rehabilitation services to those who've suffered orthopedic and spinal injuries.

For patients needing orthopedic surgery, HCA Midwest Health is proud to be the premier destination in the Kansas City area for robotic-assisted surgery. With nearly 100 robotic-trained physicians and

28 robotic surgical systems in six of our hospitals, HCA Midwest Health has performed more than one-third of all robotic surgeries in Kansas City over the last six years. Patients who undergo robotic surgery experience fewer side effects, less blood loss and pain, reduced risk of infection, shorter hospital stays and quicker recoveries.

Behavioral health

HCA Midwest Health offers a standalone psychiatric hospital, as well as five inpatient and six outpatient behavioral health programs for seniors, adults and adolescents, to best meet and accommodate the mental health needs of our patients. Our inpatient units feature 18 adolescent and 16 geriatric beds, while our outpatient offerings include a partial hospitalization program, intensive outpatient program and electroconvulsive therapy.

- · Renovating the women's and children's space at Overland Park Regional Medical Center to add state-of-the-art antepartum, labor and delivery and postpartum suites and a dedicated entrance for pediatric patients and expectant mothers
- · Adding enhanced imaging technology at Centerpoint Medical Center, including new cardiac and oncology PET CT equipment for more accurate diagnoses and new oncology PET CT equipment to help decrease treatment time
- · Building a new hybrid operating room at Menorah Medical Center to enhance surgeons' capabilities in treating complex neurological and vascular cases
- · Constructing a new ambulatory surgery center near Lee's Summit Medical Center to expand patients' access to surgical services
- Expanding the ICU at Belton Regional Medical Center to include 14 beds in large rooms, each with private bathrooms and showers
- · Breaking ground on a new bulk oxygen storage tank at Lafayette Regional Health Center to allow the facility to hold more oxygen and treat higher-acuity patients

HCA Midwest Health Advanced Leadership Certificate Program

Developed in partnership with Rockhurst University's Helzberg School of Management, the HCA Midwest Health Advanced Leadership Certificate Program helps colleagues hone their business and management acumen and earn 12 credit hours, which can be applied toward the 30 total hours needed to earn an MBA from Rockhurst University.

Our colleagues' mental wellness is a top priority, and we provide a robust benefits package to give our colleagues and their family members resources to cope through tough times.

Nurse Care — This 24/7 helpline for our full- and part-time hospital-based nurses provides free and confidential resources to help colleagues manage anxiety, balance work and life responsibilities, practice self-care and much more. It includes education, counseling, workshops, facility visits and in-person or virtual care provided by licensed psychologists, social workers, alcohol and drug counselors, and marriage and family therapists.

Optum Wellbeing resources — This partnership offers colleagues and members of their immediate household free counseling sessions in-person or via phone or text. Optum also offers a free referral service to help colleagues find professional services like child, elder and pet care, home and auto maintenance, education support and legal resources.

Doctor On Demand — Colleagues with an eligible HCA Healthcare medical plan can speak with a board-certified physician any time, day or night, through this telehealth service. Physicians provide care for 90% of the most common health conditions, including stress, anxiety and depression.

Bright Horizons Care Advantage —

Colleagues have access to a free membership to Sittercity when looking for a babysitter, nanny, elder care provider, dog walker or housekeeper. The free membership includes caregiver profiles with photos, biographies, rates, references and reviews – and an unlimited number of standard background checks.

Progyny — In 2022, HCA Healthcare formed a new partnership with Progyny, a leading fertility benefits solution, to provide eligible colleagues access to comprehensive treatment coverage, personalized guidance and access to premier specialists to support unique paths to parenthood.

We continually invest in the technologies, infrastructure and clinical education nurses need to develop professionally and to continue providing the exceptional care our patients expect. StarRN Program

Our Specialty Training Apprenticeship for Registered Nurses (StaRN) program provides intense post-graduate training to newly licensed nurses. The 12- to 23-week program combines classroom instruction, a robust simulation experience and hands-on clinical training for nurses specializing in the medical/surgical, telemetry, intensive and progressive care units, and emergency and operating room areas.

StarTECH Patient Care Technician (PCT) Program

This five-week training program, which includes classroom and clinical preparation, is an integral part of the HCA Healthcare Clinical Standards of Excellence. Through the program, PCT leads share best practices to improve operational efficiencies and improve PCT retention throughout HCA Midwest Health.

HCA Midwest Health launched the FastTrack Pathway to Clinical Care program in 2021, which allows colleagues to earn an associate's degree for non-license-required positions through a partner community college for no out-of-pocket tuition costs. The program has since expanded throughout HCA Healthcare, and more than 130 HCA Healthcare colleagues began their journey toward a clinical degree in 2022.

Research Medical Center School of Radiologic Technology ...

This fully accredited, 23-month program prepares individuals to sit for the ARRT examination and become entry-level radiographers, as well as provides the academic requirements for those seeking a career as a computed tomography technologist. Graduates of the Research Medical Center School of Radiologic Technology routinely achieve the highest programmatic test results in the nation. In May 2023, 12 students graduated from the program six of whom accepted full-time positions at Research Medical Center.

Research College of Nursing

Trusted for more than 115 years, Research College of Nursing is the Kansas City area's largest, and longest running, single-purpose nursing institution that prepares nurses to thrive in complex healthcare environments.

The college offers a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) in a one-year accelerated track with bachelor's degree required, or a two-year track with prerequisites required. Incoming BSN students can take advantage of the HCA Healthcare Work Loan Forgiveness program, which offers up to 75% tuition assistance.

Research College of Nursing has a proud tradition of helping students seamlessly transition into their nursing careers, thanks to the strength of the region's leading healthcare system, HCA Midwest Health. In fact, the college boasts a 100% success rate of having BSN students employed six months after graduation.

In 2022, Research College of Nursing ranked No. 7 Best Nursing School in Missouri and No. 1 in Kansas City, Missouri, by Nursing Schools Almanac.

\$34 million investment for the future of nursing

In March 2023, HCA Midwest Health announced a comprehensive \$34.5 million investment in Research College of Nursing from HCA Healthcare. This significant capital investment will not only provide for additional physical space and innovative new education resources, it will also boost the college's capacity to prepare future nurses - nurses we hope to welcome to our HCA Midwest Health family.

The investment will also create a new 78,000-square-foot Center for Clinical Advancement, pairing modern education facilities with innovative simulation opportunities to help clinicians bridge the gap between classroom learning and bedside care.

Besides increasing access to education for students, it will also provide more opportunities for our existing colleagues to further advance their nursing careers. In fact, developing leaders is a cornerstone of Research College of Nursing's mission, and many nurses throughout HCA Midwest Health have earned advanced degrees, resulting in their advancements to leadership positions.



Educating the masses*

Research College of Nursing's award-winning academic practice partnership with Research Medical Center has become a model of excellence for HCA Healthcare facilities across the nation.

In fact, on a larger scale, HCA Healthcare continues expanding access to nursing education and enhancing the pipeline of nurses throughout the country. In 2022, HCA Healthcare opened nine new Galen College of Nursing campuses across the country, bringing the total to 14 campuses. In addition to Research Colleague of Nursing programs, HCA Midwest Health colleagues can take advantage of Galen's online programs to further their education.

Summer camp explores nursing careers

For one week in June, 60 area junior and senior high school students received an up-close view of what a nursing career entails. 
